An article in the August edition of *Living Lutheran*, a monthly magazine from the ELCA, began with the above

title. The article describes how Preston Meadow Lutheran Church in Plano, Texas challenged its parishioners to be generous.

There was a catch; they did not have to be generous with their own money. Someone donated \$150,000 and broke it down into \$250, \$500, and \$1,000, placed the money in envelopes and on a special Sunday gave them to the parishioners with one instruction. The instruction was that they were to be joyful in their generosity and to act on the greatest need that God had placed in their hearts. Money multiplied and many people were helped that day and week, and the giving continued. When a visitor came to church, instead of being asked to give money, they were asked what charity they would like a \$25 gift to be sent.

Joyful generosity! Though we may not have other people's money to share, we have our own. And once sharing happens, it becomes like a snowball rolling down a hill. It grows and becomes almost unstoppable. A former parishioner had a windfall of \$1,000 come their way, and they needed many things for their family; however, their first thought was to tithe the money. They gave a gift of \$100 or 10% of their windfall to the work of the church.

Being a joyful giver is realizing that God is the provider of all that we have. In response to God's love, to the blessings we have received from God, we are encouraged to be a blessing.

As we trust in God and God's amazing promises through Jesus—of forgiveness, eternal life, and never walking alone—let us respond as a joyful giver!


